Introduction

We invite interested parties and contributors to register their interest in this review by submitting a completed registration form.

This registration form is for **UK producers** of goods that are like the goods subject to review (the UK like goods). If you are not a UK producer, please download and complete the relevant registration form from the public file (public-file.trade-remedies.service.gov.uk/case/ir0093) if you wish to provide information as part of this review. If your company both produces the like goods, and imports the goods subject to review from the PRC, you should complete this UK producer registration form (and not the importer registration form).

To register to this case, you need to provide both a confidential and a non-confidential version of this form. Your non-confidential version should be as similar as possible to your confidential version except for the redaction of the confidential information.

Both copies must be returned to the TRA by **04 August 2026** via the Trade Remedies Service (portal.trade-remedies.service.gov.uk). It is your responsibility to ensure the non-confidential version – which may be placed on the public file – does not contain any confidential information, which includes personal contact information, names and signatures.¹

All information provided to the TRA in confidence will be treated as confidential in accordance with regulation 45 of the Trade Remedies (Dumping and Subsidisation) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019 (the Regulations) and will not be disclosed (except in limited circumstance as permitted by regulation 46 of the Regulations) and will be stored in protected systems.

Our UK like goods are distinguished by high-grade local clay bodies, specialized hand-glazing techniques, and design driven innovation resulting in luxury and superior quality pieces.

We supply these goods primarily to HNW individuals, premium retail stockists, hospitality businesses, interior designers, and direct-to-consumer online retail platforms across the UK and international markets. We also sell directly to individual local and global customers on our own retail website.

The goods subject to review and UK-produced tableware share identical physical characteristics and primary end-use functions. While UK-manufactured goods are distinguished by superior craft, local employment, and strict quality standards, artificially low-priced Chinese imports create surface level like-for-like options, depressing market prices and distorting consumer value expectations across all segments. Underpriced and low quality volume imports directly undercut domestic producers, forcing UK manufacturers to absorb severe cost pressures or lose vital market share. Maintaining trade remedies is essential to offset unfair price distortion, protect skilled UK manufacturing jobs, and ensure fair competition.

13. The TRA uses product control numbers (PCNs) to define and distinguish the different types or subcategories of goods that fall under the goods description of the goods subject to review. Subcategories are developed on the basis of differences in the physical and/or commercial characteristics which may impact the price at which each subcategory is sold.
