### Safeguard Measures Category 1 - HRC Coil and Strip Quotas - Other Countries

Dear 

Further to our correspondence with your colleagues at TRA, we now submit our formal application for a TRQ relating specifically to the following three tariff headings currently included in Category 1 of the Safeguard Measures :

7211 1300, 7211 1400, 7211 1900

This product is described in Eurostat as 'commonly known as wide flats'. Since the advent of the Safeguard Measures when UK was still part of the EU, and continued in our own Measures, this product has been part of the HRC and HR Strip Category, even though it is produced by a completely different process to Hr Coil and Strip, but until recently this has not been of particular concern.

The material under 7211 1300 which our company has imported for more than twenty years comes from Switzerland, i.e. Other Countries, and other imports come from Turkey, which has a specific though small quota for Category 1.

The change of circumstances stems from the fact that the quota for Category 1 is now being fully utilised by HRC Coil and Strip, most of it by domestic producer Tata. Until recently, the quota issue had not impacted on wide flats, but this has now changed and it does to the extent that we have just had to cancel an order due to the fact that it cannot sustain a 25% duty due to the quota being used by HRC and Strip.

We would therefore propose that a separate sub-classification be made for these three tariff headings so that traditional business can be maintained.

We are of course at your disposal to provide whatever supporting evidence you may require in order to pursue this request.
