Anti-dumping transition review on electric bicycles originating in the People's Republic of China

Notification of final sample

Given the number of responses in the registration period, the Trade Remedies Authority (TRA), will limit its examination of overseas exporters.

The TRA published the [notice of proposed sample](#) on 23 June 2023. The TRA received two submissions in response:

- 1) The TRA received [comments](#) on behalf of Giant Electric Vehicle (KunShan) Co. Ltd (Giant) requesting that they are removed from the sample. The TRA has considered the request and will retain Giant in the sample. As explained in the notice of proposed sample, our methodology is based on a statistically valid method consisting of two criteria. We consider that this approach gives us the best representation of exports to the UK as well as sales on the domestic market in the People's Republic of China.
- 2) In addition the TRA received a [request for individual treatment](#) from Xiangjin (Tianjin) Cycle Co. Ltd. The TRA has considered the request and the examination of five overseas exporters would be unduly burdensome on the case team and is likely to risk the timely completion of the transition review, and so we will not include Xiangjin (Tianjin) Cycle Co. Ltd in the sample.

This notification is not intended to preclude the TRA from limiting its examination to a sample of transactions for the purchase of like goods.

Overseas exporter sampling

Based on the information available to the TRA, the sample will include the following four overseas exporters. In accordance with Regulation 56(3)(b) of The Trade Remedies (Dumping and Subsidisation) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019, the sample is based on the two companies with the largest volume of exports, and the two companies with the largest volume of exports and domestic sales.

1. Zhongxin Power (Tianjin) Bicycle Co. Ltd
2. Jinhua Vision Industry Co. Ltd
3. Changzhou HJ Pedal Co. Ltd
4. Giant Electric Vehicle (KunShan) Co. Ltd

Sampled overseas exporters will be expected to provide adequate responses to questionnaires and allow the TRA to verify the data provided.
