



Transition review TS0069: Continuous Filament Glass Fibre originating in Egypt

Note to the public file – Confirmed position in respect of evidence of the existence of a UK industry in the like goods

On 10 July 2025, the Trade Remedies Authority (TRA) published a [note to the public file](#) summarising the events to date regarding the closure of the sole known UK producer of the like goods, Electric Glass Fiber (EGF) UK, and inviting further comments on the existence of a UK industry by **31 July 2025**.

The window for comments has now passed. The TRA has not received any evidence of the existence of a UK industry in respect of the like goods, and therefore has no evidence of a domestic industry which could suffer a continuation or recurrence of injury should the measure be revoked. On the basis of this lack of evidence, the TRA is proceeding expeditiously with the remainder of this transition review.

Following the publication of this note, we will publish a further timeline to the public file. This will set out the revised estimated timescale for case milestones, including publication of the Statement of Essential Facts which will set out the facts which form the basis of our recommendation in respect of the measure under review.

The TRA has received some responses to the business survey which was open 27 May – 26 July. Given the circumstances of this transition review, which developed after the survey opened for responses, the responses will not be used by the TRA to inform an Economic Interest Test (EIT). However, the TRA is grateful to the organisations that took the time to provide responses, as having evidence from a range of affected groups is key to conducting an effective EIT.
