TRANSITION REVIEW No. TD0035

Anti-dumping duties on certain pneumatic tyres used for buses or lorries originating in the People's Republic of China

Public notice

On 20 December 2023 the Trade Remedies Authority (TRA) published a [notice to public file](#) indicating that we did not expect to undertake detailed recalculations of the anti-dumping amount.

After conducting verification activities and analysing the information available, the TRA now does expect to recalculate the anti-dumping amount. We are carefully considering our approach to this, and the analysis will be conducted alongside our determinations on whether:

- the dumping of the goods subject to review would be likely to continue or recur if the anti-dumping amount were no longer applied to those goods; and
- injury to the UK industry would be likely to continue or recur if the anti-dumping amount were no longer applied to those goods.

The TRA will outline the facts which form the basis for our decisions in the Statement of Essential Facts. This will give parties the opportunity to comment on the information and any calculations before the final determination.

In addition, following our [notice on 21 September 2023](#), we would like to invite producers in Brazil to participate in the investigation to provide certain sales and cost data, including commercially sensitive information, in order to assist us with our investigation. We will treat this information as confidential and will also ask any co-operating producer to provide a non-confidential version or summary of the information, so that we can publish this on our public file. If multiple producers choose to participate, we may use an appropriate sampling methodology to select who to involve further. If you are a producer in Brazil and would like to participate in the investigation, please register your interest via the Trade Remedies Service by completing and uploading a Third Country Producer Pre-Sampling Questionnaire (PSQ) by 25 April 2024.
