Reason for extension:	<i>Why are you requesting an extension?</i>		
	Our client is working to the best of its ability to collect all the information necessary to complete the questionnaires. However, we would be most grateful if the TRA could extend the deadline by two weeks, i.e., until Monday, 12 April 2026, for the following reasons. First, these are two parallel investigations, and the companies concerned should be afforded sufficient time to complete two questionnaires instead of one. Furthermore, each questionnaire requires the provision of a very large amount of information. As the TRA is no doubt aware, the collection and preparation of the requested material require extensive work and considerable time. This collection and preparation exercise is rendered even more onerous and time-consuming by the fact that many documents need to be translated into English. An extension until 12 April 2026 would allow our client to ensure that all relevant documents are translated, reviewed, and incorporated into its responses.		

	• Second, there are two related companies involved in the preparation of the questionnaire responses, namely, an exporting producer established in China and an importer established in the United Kingdom. As the TRA will understand, given the different locations of the companies involved in the preparation of the responses, coordination between these companies is not always straightforward. An extension of the deadline would facilitate effective communication and coordination among these companies and would help to ensure that the TRA receives coherent responses. • Third, several of the questions raised in the questionnaires require input from finance personnel and coordination across multiple departments. The current deadline moreover coincides with the finance departments' monthly closing process, which significantly limits their availability to work on the questionnaire responses at the most crucial time. Additional time is therefore needed to gather and verify the necessary information. • Fourth, Dingli Machinery UK Limited ("Dingli UK") has no previous experience in anti-dumping or anti-subsidy investigations. While Zhejiang Dingli Machinery Co., Ltd ("Zhejiang Dingli") has been involved in past US and EU investigations concerning imports of mobile access equipment, this experience is insufficient to address the requirements of the present investigations. Additional time is therefore required for our guidance and assistance to the client, and in particular to Dingli UK, to ensure the correct and detailed completion of the questionnaires. • Fifth, some of the sales personnel who are most familiar with the sales-related questions are currently on business trips abroad. The time difference and the inability to communicate face-to-face have significantly slowed down the preparation of the relevant responses.
